Photography Rules

- Plan ahead
- The background is more important than the subject
- Fill the frame
- The rule of thirds

Plan Ahead

- Determine what type of event you will be photographing
- Will you be the only photographer?
- How will these images be used
- What is the location for the photos?

Fill the frame

- Some photos can be saved by cropping after
- Do not be afraid to get close to your subject





Rule of thirds

- What are the points of interest in this shot?
- Where am I intentionally placing them?

Review your photos

- Blurry, out of focus, poor lighting, incorrect uniforms? DO NOT PUBLISH!
- Review every photo, every time
- Only publish the very best
- 10 amazing photos has a bigger impact than 100 so so photos.



Styles of photography


- Vertical vs Horizontal
- Photo vs Video
- 1x1, 3x4, 4x5
- Panorama







- Always shoot video horizontal!
- Native format for most cameras is 2:3
- Crop to different formats in post production






Equipment

- You do NOT need \$10,000 worth of camera equipment to take a good photo
- A modern cell phone is often good enough for most CAP Photography
- Lighting is king!
- Studio lighting with your CELL PHONE for \$70
