

Operation Pulse Lift Mission



<u>Operation Pulse Lift</u> is a <u>nationwide Disaster Relief</u> capability, employed within the Congressionally chartered authority of Civil Air Patrol's <u>Emergency Services</u> mission. Its intent is to provide enabling capabilities and force-multiplier resources <u>supporting the National Blood Program</u>. It provides facilities, logistics support, personnel, air/ground transportation, communications, and command & control capabilities; supporting responses <u>to regional/nationwide disasters</u>. It also supports the <u>Armed Services Blood Program</u> collection/distribution operations during wartime/contingencies and disasters.





Operation Pulse Lift Capabilities



Operation Pulse Lift – Provides:



- Facilities and/or trained CAP Blood Support Teams (BST) to set up and operate temporary Blood Donor Centers (BDC) across nation
- → A nationwide walking donor blood bank (58,000+ members/families).
- □ Air & ground transport support to the Armed Services Blood Program (ASBP), the American Red Cross, and other blood agencies.
- BST augmentation at ASBP blood collection sites and transport of blood products. Two locations in Texas have been supported.



Operation Pulse Lift Capabilities



Operation Pulse Lift – Provides:



- BDC Blood Donor Centers (Temporary) for collection of blood.
- <u>BST</u> Blood Support Teams for augmentation of blood collection teams from the American Red Cross/other agencies and the Armed Services Blood Program Office. During emergencies, CAP BSTs may also augment military personnel at permanent BDC locations for packaging, palletization, and loading of blood for transshipment.
- <u>BTT</u> Blood Transport Teams with aircraft/aircrew, vehicles/drivers, dispatchers/communicators, and other positions to assist in the safe and expedited point-to-point transport of blood and blood products.
 - BTCT Blood Transshipment Center (BTC) Teams to augment Air Force personnel managing BTCs at west and east coast installations.



Operation Pulse Lift - History Pre-COVID 2017-2019




- Began 12 April 2017 in Mesa, AZ
- Three collection events/year (Mar, Sep, Dec)
- Initially a Joint CAP & ARC effort.
- CAP squadron building used for collections.
- Collections done by ARC members.
- Admin/Support/Logistics provided by CAP members.
- Goal: Collect 300 units for 900 lifesaving procedures.
- Outcome: 527 units collected for 1,581 patients.
- Listed on ARC State Emergency/Disaster Blood Collection List.
- Became a great ES and Recruitment/Marketing opportunity.
- Set the stage for CAP COVID-19 response.



Operation Pulse Lift Support to Armed Services Blood Program



Under the guidance of Air Force Instruction 44-105, *Air Force Blood Program*, Civil Air Patrol provides personnel, facilities, ground vehicles, mobile communications, and aircraft/aircrews to support the Department of Defense's Armed Services Blood Program (ASBP), through the Air Force Blood Program Office, in wartime and in peacetime - Defense Support to Civil Authorities operations. Mission approval and Operational Control is by the Commander, 1st Air Force; and Tactical Control, is through the Director of the AFBP when conducted at nation-wide military installations and service academies.

Operation Pulse Lift Support to ASBP



PulseEx 2021-01

- PulseEX 2021-1 was an Air Force Total Force demonstration of Operation Pulse Lift (OPL) support to Air Force Blood Program (AFBP) field operations at Dyess Air Force Base, Texas.
- The Texas Wing (TXWG) of CAP provided Blood Support Team (BST) augmentation and both aviation (primary) and ground support for transport of blood products from an Air Force Mobile Blood Collection Site at Dyess AFB to the AFBP Blood Donor Center (BDC) at Joint Base San Antonio (Lackland).
- Funding for CAP portion of demonstration came out of CAP Baseline.

PulseEx 2022-01

- PulseEX 2022-1 will be an Air Force Total Force exercise/demonstration of Operation Pulse Lift (OPL) support to Air Force Blood Program collections from the Air Force Academy in Colorado.
- The Texas Wing (TXWG) of CAP will provide ground transport of blood products from an Air Force Mobile Blood Collection Site at the Air Force Academy to the AFBPO Blood Donor Center (BDC) at Joint Base San Antonio (Lackland).
- The Colorado Wing will provide Blood Support Team augmentation for two-days at the Air Force Academy BDC
- The mission will be funded by the U.S. Air Force as a Headquarters 1st Air Force mission.




