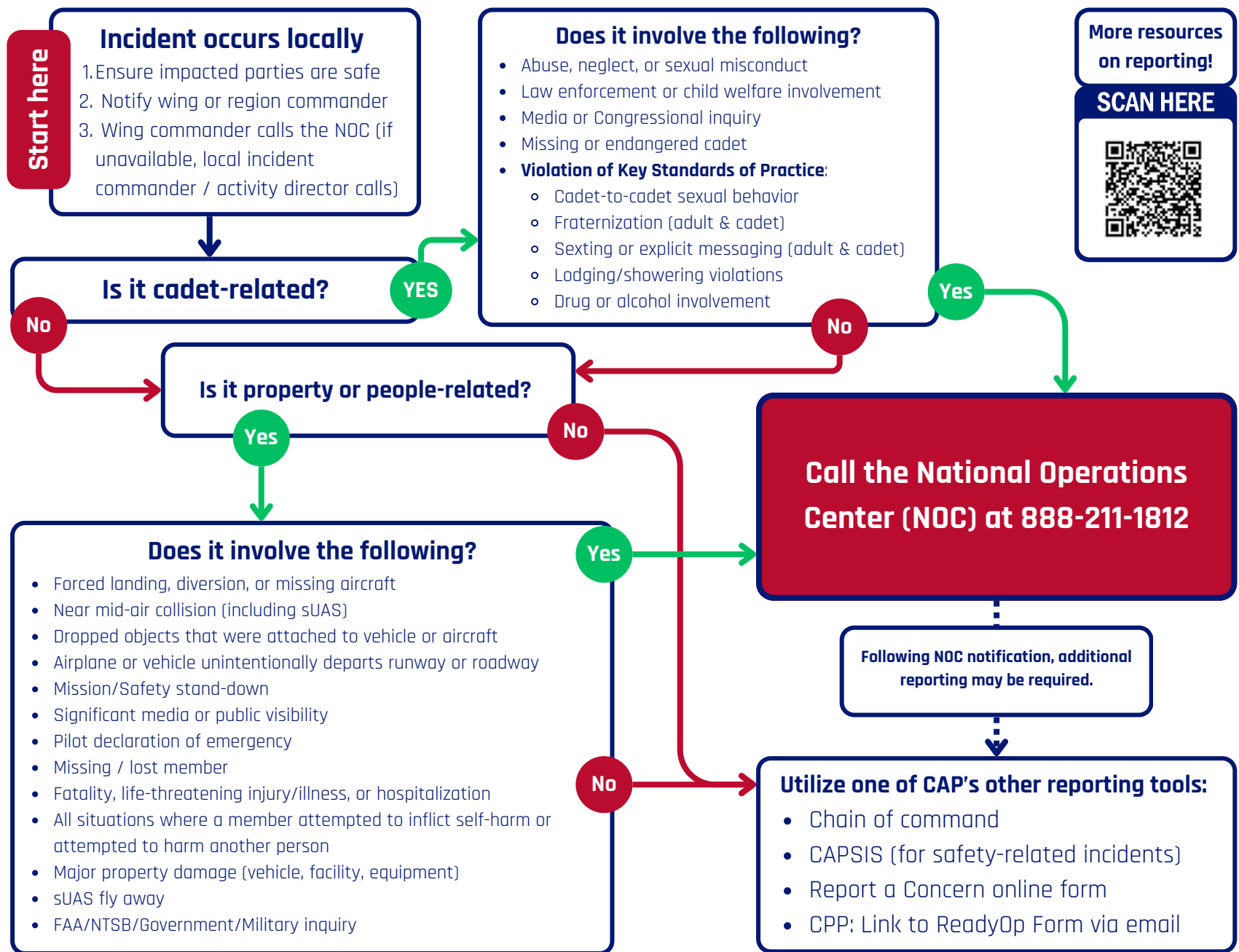

| <p>Does it involve the following? <i>This is not an exhaustive list. If in doubt call your wing/region commander or the NOC (if wing / region commander is unavailable).</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Allegation/suspicion of abuse, neglect, sexual misconduct. • Violations of Key Standards of Practice <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Cadet-to-cadet sexual behavior ○ Fraternalization (adult leader & cadet) ○ Sexting (adult leader & cadet) ○ Lodging in the same quarters or tent with cadets not in the immediate family of the adult leader ○ Showering, nudity or partial nudity in the presence of cadets (or deliberate observance of cadets in such a state) ○ Illegal drugs or alcohol usage (given, offered, or adult leader under the influence while around cadets) • Missing or endangered cadet • Law enforcement (or child welfare agency) involvement (including any mandatory reports made in line with state statutes) • Media/Congressional inquiry <p>Reference: CAPR 60-2, Cadet Protection Program (para. 4.1.1.4-4.1.1.5, 4.1.2.2)</p> | <p>Does it involve the following (property)? <i>This is not an exhaustive list. If in doubt call your wing/region commander or the NOC (if wing / region commander is unavailable).</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Forced landing, diversion, or missing aircraft • Near-mid air collision (including sUAS) • Dropped objects that were attached to vehicle or aircraft • Airplane or vehicle unintentionally departs a runway or roadway • Pilot declaration of emergency • Aircraft engine failure • Mission/safety stand-down • FAA/NTSB/government/military inquiry • Significant media or public visibility (including press releases) • sUAS fly away <p>Reference: CAPR 160-2, Safety Reporting, Reviewing, and Action Planning (para. 6.1, 6.5, and Attachment 3).</p> | <p>Does it involve the following (people)? <i>This is not an exhaustive list. If in doubt call your wing/region commander or the NOC (if wing / region commander is unavailable).</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Fatality or life-threatening injury/illness • All situations where a member attempted to inflict self-harm or attempted to harm another person • Hospitalization • Missing or lost member • Major property damage (vehicle, facility, equipment) • Serious hazard forcing stand-down or cancellation <p>Reference: CAPR 160-2, Safety Reporting, Reviewing, and Action Planning (para. 6.1, 6.4, 6.5, and Attachment 3).</p> |
| <p>Call the NOC with the following information ready (NHQ uses a ReadyOp form sent via email to collect this information):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Who was involved (cadet/adult, roles). • What occurred (description of alleged behavior or concern). • When/where it happened. • Immediate actions taken. • Contacts with law enforcement/child protective services. | <p>Call the NOC with the following information ready:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Aircraft tail number and sortie/mission ID. • Location and time of incident. • Description of mishap/incident. • Injuries or damages. • Actions taken (emergency response, notifications, grounding). | <p>Call the NOC with the following information ready:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Name/role of injured/affected member. • Description of injury/illness/hazard. • Location, time, and circumstances. • Immediate response (first aid, EMS, evacuation). • Current status (released, admitted, ongoing treatment). |
| <p>After NOC notification is communicated to CAP/CC, CAP/CD, CAP/CP, and CAP/SE, CAP/CP assumes coordination responsibilities in line with CAPR 60-2. These include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Coordinating communication between CAP/GC, wing CC and wing JA • Coordinating with MAC for communication needs, and all media inquiries • Coordinating with CAP/DP for any membership actions needed | <p>After NOC notification is communicated to CAP/CC, CAP/CD, CAP/SE, CAP/SE assumes coordination responsibilities in line with CAPR 160-2 and CAPSIS.</p> <p><i>The National Operations Center (NOC) coordinates CAP's support for civil authorities and military commanders. This includes airborne imagery, communications support for homeland security, disaster operations, as well as low-level surveys and range support for military operations.</i></p> <p>For non-emergency requests, you can also reach the NOC via email at opscenter@capnhq.gov.</p> | |
