Initial Legislative Day Results: On March 2 CAP held about 440 meetings with Members of Congress and staff to talk about CAP. As of March 27 there have been 86 House "actionable requests" from those meetings for help with appropriations requests, draft letters of support and other actions. CAP also recruited 26 Members of Congress and staff into the Congressional Squadron. Because the appropriations process is running late this year we expect more appropriations-related requests, especially from the Senate, over the next couple of months.

CAP Appropriations:

FY17 Funding: The government is currently operating under a Continuing Resolution (CR) until April 28. At this time a House passed FY17 Defense Appropriations Bill (HR 1301) is awaiting action in the Senate either as a separate appropriations bill or the vehicle for a Omnibus bill (which would include all the other FY17 appropriations bills). It is also possible no action will be taken with the result being either a yearlong CR or a government shutdown. In the FY17 bill CAP would receive \$28.0M for operation and maintenance (O&M), \$10.3M for aircraft and \$1.7 M for vehicles.

FY18 Funding: This year's funding request is for \$30.8M for O&M, \$10.6M for aircraft and \$1.7M for vehicles. The O&M request is \$2.8M more than in FY17 while aircraft is slightly higher (\$300,000) and vehicles remain the same. The O&M increase is due to critical issues including Federal ADS-B requirements for all CAP aircraft, important cyber security upgrades, and replacement of non-repairable communications equipment. The President's FY18 Budget is not expected until sometime in May which will delay the appropriations process this year.

Welcome Ron Olienyk to Operations: Ron comes to us with a variety of experience, and many of you have worked with him in his prior position as the eLearning Program Manager for Distance Learning. Ron will be directly supervising the Chiefs of Operations Support, Standardization and Evaluation and Training while also helping the John Desmarais manage activities across the Operations Directorate and providing some additional continuity and leadership support. Operations Pre-Conference Presentations and Annual Conference Learning Labs: The annual conference is just a few months away. Feedback and participation in our Operations Pre-Conference and the annual conference Learning Labs is always good, but we are always trying to work to make improvements. The plan this year is to expand the operations pre-conference to two days, the 30th and 31st of August, and limit operations learning labs to one per period so that personnel can take advantage of all we are offering. We are also intending to provide more hands-on learning opportunities where possible, though we will also continue the live broadcast feed as well. To that end, if you have any suggestions for hands-on activities or presentations that you would like to see, please send them to DO@capnhq.gov no later than the 30th of April.

Standardization/Evaluation:

- The Chief of Standardization and Evaluation position is currently vacant. Joe Piccotti has moved over to be our Chief of Special Missions. Until we can hire a new Chief of Stan/Eval, Joe is helping answer day to day questions with assistance from John Desmarais, Ron Olienyk, and Capt Susan Parson. We expect to advertise this position formally once the funding situation for this FY is resolved. In the interim, questions can be sent to dov@capnhq.gov.
- As of this writing, the new CAPR 70-1 is in its final stages of coordination with CAP-USAF. We expect that it will be approved very soon, and will be implemented in early May, allowing for approximately one month for the field to review, develop updated supplements if desired and ask questions. CAP NHQ will also be hosting several webinars at the end of April highlighting the new regulation as well as supporting changes in WMIRS.

Health Services: Our staff is working on a new CISM regulation that we expect to begin formal coordination with Napoleon's Corporals and such later this spring.

Communications:

- **Annual Plans:** Per CAPR 100-1, para. 2.2, Wing communications plans for 2017 are due 10 April. Region communications plans were due 10 January. Communications Plan document templates are mandatory for 2017 and have been made available at the Communications Program web site accessible through eServices. Contact DOKP@capnhq.gov for additional information.
- **DOD Exercise**: Civil Air Patrol demonstrated readiness to launch over 100 aircraft nationally during a recent Department of Defense exercise. The exercise, which included multiple military and federal agencies, simulated a cyber-attack causing commercial communications systems to fail. In such a real-world emergency, CAP could be tasked with extensive damage assessment air sorties.

This is a developing mission for CAP. Cyber-attacks and other events that take out some or all of the commercial communications and power systems constitute a real threat in the eyes of DoD and active steps are being taken to prepare. CAP is fortunate to have been included in those preparations. Exercise tasking was received via secure High Frequency (HF) radio messages and distributed to wings via CAP's extensive HF radio network. Wings responded to the tasking as tabletop sorties, identified available aircraft and air crews, and reported back by radio. Those reports of available assets were used as exercise input by command staff at the top level of the exercise in DoD.

The exercise February 28 was the third such DoD exercise involving CAP in recent months simulating communications systems failure. We are currently developing an after action report to document lessons learned which will be applied to future exercises and planning.

Operations Support:

- Applications are still being accepted for the National Emergency Services Academy (NESA) which will be run from the 8th through the 22nd of July, 2017 at Camp Atterbury, Indiana. Details about upcoming courses are available online at www.nesa.cap.gov and interested personnel can register online.

Special Missions: The Green Flag program is looking for experienced CAP pilots with a G-1000 qualification and at a minimum an instrument rating. Additionally, Pilot or Sensor Operator candidates should not weigh more than 190 lbs. We anticipate holding another Green Flag University (GFU) in July of 2017. Members wishing to apply for future crewmember openings in the Green Flag program and possibly attend this GFU can contact Joe Piccotti at NHQ: lpiccotti@capnhq.gov.

Training:

- The annual training and flying plan modules will open on the 3^{rd} of April for FY18 entry. Just like prior FYs, plans are expected to be complete and approved through your Liaison Regions by the end of July. There have been no significant changes to the entry module in eServices, but CAP/DO & DOT will host a webinar highlighting lessons learned from FY16 and FY17 so far on the 6^{th} of April see below.
