




BIOGRAPHY

Colonel John R. Longley Jr., CAP

Colonel John R. Longley Jr. serves as a Member-at-Large on Civil Air Patrol's Board of Governors (BoG).

As CAP's top governing body, the 11-member BoG consists of four U.S. Air Force appointees, three members appointed jointly by the Secretary of the Air Force and CAP's National Commander, and four members-at-large selected by CAP's Senior Advisory Group. The BoG moves CAP forward through collective decision-making to generate strategic policies, plans, and programs designed to guide it both today and tomorrow.

Col Longley joined the BoG in February 2021 as an appointee of CAP's Senior Advisory Group. A 23-year member of CAP, he served as Commander of the Oregon Wing from October 2012-September 2016. Before that he was the Pacific Region's Chief of Staff (2011-2012) and the Region's Inspector General (2011-2012). He previously was Vice Commander of the California Wing (2007-2010), Commander of Central California Group 6 (2005-2007), and Commander of the Wing's Sequoia Porterville Squadron 33 (2002-2005).



Col Longley commanded the Pacific Region on an interim basis for about six weeks (October-December 2016). He served on the Membership Action Review Panel beginning in 2018 and as an assistant instructor for Volunteer University, teaching virtual Level 5 and Incident Commander 3. He is now the Recruitment and Retention Director for the Region and also works on Felix Keynote intercepts for the Oregon Wing.

Col Longley holds Master ratings for Command, Emergency Services, and Cadet Programs and received the Distinguished Service Award in 2012 for his service as Wing Commander. He received the Gill Robb Wilson Award for achieving CAP professional development Level 5 in 2009 and was named the California Wing and Pacific Region Senior Member of the Year in 2010. He served two tours beginning in 2011 and 2016 as a member of the national Civil Air Patrol Promotion and Awards Board (Team).

He is also a pilot with about 1,100 hours of flying time and owns a Piper Warrior. In addition to his pilot certificate, he also has a commercial unmanned air system permit.

In addition to his CAP service, Col Longley was a member of the U.S. Air Force from November 1969-May 1973, rising to the rank of Staff Sergeant and serving in various leadership, management, and supervisory positions. He was awarded the Air Force Commendation Medal while in Vietnam with the Military Assistance Command.

Col Longley retired after a 32-year career as City Manager in the California municipalities of Porterville, Marina and Avalon. He worked for six more years as Porterville Airport Area Manager and as Director of Crater Lake-Klamath Regional Airport in Oregon,

He is an Oregon Principal Real Estate Broker, recently launching TJ Longley Realty LEA. He is a member of the Klamath County Real Estate Board, serving as Chair of the board's Governmental Affairs Committee.

A resident of Keno, Oregon, he is married to retired CAP Lt. Col. Theresa Longley, his wife of 48 years, who is still active as a real estate broker. They have three children and 13 grandchildren.
