1. Effective 3 January 2022, Louisiana Wing will revert to Phase 2 of the COVID-19 remobilization plan. Units may hold one-day events such as aerospace education activities, field trips, training exercises, flight clinics, community support events, Cadet Orientation flights and similar activities.
2. One-day activities is subject to the following limitations and safety requirements:
 - a. In accordance with guidance from national headquarters, meetings and activities must be limited to a maximum fifty persons while maintaining six-foot social distancing.
 - b. Wear of facial coverings is mandatory at any time six-foot social distancing cannot be maintained. For activities during which social distancing is impractical (e.g., pilot or aircrew training, travelling in corporate vehicles, etc.), members must wear facial coverings. Note: State guidelines recommend always wearing mask indoors and outdoors when social distancing is difficult.
 - c. All activities, exercises, or other activities involving more than 10 individuals will require the assignment of an activity director, whose responsibilities will include: familiarizing him- or herself with Phase 2 remobilization procedures and limitations; completion of required COVID-19 Risk Management forms; securing necessary supplies such as face coverings, sanitizing wipes, hand washing facilities, etc.; coordinating with health services officers for proper screening and temperature checks of all attendees; and developing and communicating plans and dates for go/no-go decisions for each event.
 - d. A written attendance log is mandatory for all activities involving more than ten persons and must be retained for future review.
 - e. Participation is limited to members whose general health places them at lower risk for COVID-19 vulnerability. Members who consider themselves in a high-risk category should refrain from attending activities. Members exhibiting a temperature of 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit, flu-like symptoms, or

who have encountered individuals exhibiting COVID-19-like symptoms shall not be permitted to attend activities. Members with existing health conditions, compromised immune systems, and/or over the age of sixty-five should be asked to participate via a virtual medium as is possible.

- f. Non-essential travel in corporate vehicles or aircraft may continue with consideration for appropriate risk mitigation.
- g. Reasonable CAP flight activities may resume provided that all crew members wear facial coverings and use common sense mitigation measures.
- h. Overnight events are prohibited.

The Governor of Louisiana has currently declared the state to be in Phase 3 reopening. In the event of a new declaration, any additional more restrictive guidelines set forth shall by the state shall supersede those listed here as of the effective date of the new proclamation. In such an event, Louisiana Wing will communicate additional guidance to unit leadership.

Summary

As we move back into Phase II,

- Guidelines regarding facial covering and social distancing remain in effect.
- Flight activities are allowed under the following:
- Small group crew training (units or groups of locally conducted training for members to earn crew qualifications, Wing level group or area classes are to be avoided.)
- Carefully pre-scheduled local CAP Orientation Flights (Everyone does not show up for the day at one time, but rather, two cadets show up for an assigned flight block with plenty of time in between before the next cadets

arrive). Everyone is wearing a mask. Pick locations where social distancing can still be done if for some reason people show up early.

- One day activities on the Unit Level are authorized with the caveat that all reasonable and prudent measures as outlined are followed.
- Any illness in the unit is to be reported to the Wing Commander as soon as practical and any diagnosed case of COVID 19 should include the source of the infection if known.
- Vaccination will be encouraged for all members.
