Narrative Summary of Coordination and Events To-Date in North Carolina Wing:

- Weekly meetings have been held by the NCWG Remobilization team to continually evaluate the changing status of the health metrics.
- The Phase I plan was initially approved on 18 May 20.
- Phase 0 aircrew training and flight activities were approved by the Wing Commander IAW MG Smith's 1 Jul 20 Memo, para 3, and commenced beginning 08 July 2020.
- The Plan to enter Phase I on 15 Aug was based on the projection of our Health Metrics showing a downward trajectory over the preceding 3 weeks, in addition to the Infection Rate metric maintaining a fairly stable level in NC from 10 May 20 thru 23 Jul 20, with a range from 1.14 (max) to 1.02 (min) over 11 weeks
- NCWG entered Phase I on 15 August 20.
- Entry to CAP Phase II is planned for 15 September 2020 pending approval of this plan and satisfaction of the prescribed health metric trends. The major differences for the NCWG between Phase I and Phase II are as follows:
 - Up to 50 personnel in attendance outdoors and 25 indoors in accordance with current NC state restrictions (see Attachment 2). Once the state restrictions are relaxed to allow for at least 50 individuals indoors we will remove our 25 person indoor restriction as well.
 - Resume Cadet Orientation Flights. Scheduling one cadet per flight.
 - Resume single day events

MEMORANDUM FOR NORTH CAROLINA WING UNIT COMMANDERS

SUBJECT: NCWG REMOBILIZATION – PHASE II REMOBILIZATION PLAN

Commanders,

1. Our North Carolina Wing (NCWG) Remobilization Planning Team has been closely watching the North Carolina health metrics within North Carolina as well as the declarations by the Governor, including the most recent announcement on 1 Sept 2020. After carefully reviewing the somewhat roller-coaster infection rate over the past several weeks, the NCWG has finally met the conditions to move to **CAP Phase II**. The NCWG CAP Phase II will be adjusted to fit into the recently announced North Carolinas “Safer At Home Phase 2.5” restrictions. Additionally, our CAP Phase II Remobilization Plan has been presented to and approved by CAP National Headquarters. The date the NCWG is expecting to initiate CAP Phase II is 15 Sept 2020.

2. This approval does not eliminate the CDC Guidance and CAP safety standards of protection surrounding our COVID-19 Environment. All of the safety and protection steps required in CAP Phase I also apply in CAP Phase II. **MOST IMPORTANTLY:** Participation in CAP Phase II is at the member’s (Senior Member or Cadet) comfort level. If a member is not comfortable participating, they may participate virtually – which is OK. Units should continue to provide virtual access options for members for those CAP activities that coincide with face-to-face, in-person activities, where practical.

3. The below provides highlights of information in regards to our CAP Phase II Remobilization Plan. All CAP Phase I authorizations still apply. All Unit Commanders are to read the entire package provided to make sure all details of this plan are understood. Information regarding CAP Phase II:

- a. CAP Phase II allows for activities with 50 members or less outdoors or 25 members or fewer indoors. – this includes Cadet Programs, Emergency Services Training, Aerospace Education, Education & Training, Command Staff, etc.
- b. Cadet Orientation Rides (“O-Rides”) are now permitted with a single cadet in the aircraft and there will be no gatherings of cadets awaiting their O-Ride.

- c. Quarterly Cadet Forms (pre-filled CAPF 60-80 and 60-81) are still required prior to the activity or event
- d. No overnight activities allowed, the same as in CAP Phase I

4. The NCWG Remobilization Team will continue to keep focus on the North Carolina COVID-19 health metrics and look for the opportunity to move into CAP Phase III when conditions are met. Per CAP guidance, we cannot move into CAP Phase 3 without waiting a minimum of 4 weeks (13 October at the earliest) from the start of CAP Phase II as well as sustained decreasing infectious rates. We are kept informed of this data from the Institute of Health Metrics and Evaluation - COVID ACT NOW website: <https://covidactnow.org/us/nc>.

5. The NCWG CAP Phase II Plan is attached and provides the specific guidance detail for the approved operations, activities and actions that we are authorized to perform under this remobilization plan. If operations, activities or actions are not listed in the guidance detail, then they are not authorized to perform in this Phase. Please read the guidance detail information carefully when you receive it. All operations, activities and actions will be performed with safety and protection of our members being of paramount importance.

6. Adhering to CDC Guidelines, including wear of face coverings and sanitization of equipment and facilities while attending any in-person activity will be mandatory for all participating as we must continue to remain vigilant and exercise responsible safety behavior. With a final reminder – if a member is not comfortable participating during COVID-19 – then they should not participate.

Over the last week, North Carolina has averaged 1,580 new confirmed cases per day (15.1 for every 100,000 residents). Over the next year, this translates to around 580,000 cases and an [estimated](#) 2,900,000 infections (27.5% of the population).



Last updated 9/1/2020. Our risk levels for daily new cases are based on the ["Key Metrics for Covid Suppression"](#) by Harvard Global Health Institute and others. When estimating the number of people who will become infected in the course of a year, we rely on the [CDC's estimate](#) that confirmed cases represent as few as 10% of overall infections. 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

A significant percentage (6.7%) of COVID tests were positive, meaning that North Carolina's testing meets WHO minimums but needs to be further expanded to detect most new cases. Identifying and isolating new cases can help contain COVID without resorting to lockdowns.

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Health and Safety Requirements for Meetings and Activities

- Meetings and activities will remain virtual whenever possible.
- High risk members **SHOULD NOT** attend meetings or activities in person in Phase II, but the decision to participate in person is left up to the member based on their own self assessment.
 - The following CDC High Risk factors are current as of the August 10th (latest) update. For the most up to date information please see the CDC website at <https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/need-extra-precautions/index.html>
 - As you get older your risk for severe illness from COVID-19 increases.
 - People who live in a nursing home or long-term care facility
 - People of all ages with underlying medical conditions, particularly if not well controlled, including:
 - People with chronic lung disease or moderate to severe asthma
 - People who have serious heart conditions
 - People who are immunocompromised:
 - Many conditions can cause a person to be immunocompromised, including cancer treatment, smoking, bone marrow or organ transplantation, immune deficiencies, poorly controlled HIV or AIDS, and prolonged use of corticosteroids and other immune weakening medications
 - People with severe obesity (body mass index [BMI] of 30 or higher)
 - People with diabetes
 - People with chronic kidney disease undergoing dialysis





Health and Safety Requirements for Meetings and Activities

- No more than **50** total personnel are allowed to be in attendance for any event or meeting.
 - **50 personnel outdoors or**
 - **25 personnel indoors**
 - CAP members only (except parents).
 - Additional meeting days, additional time slots, and concurrent but separate locations are sample innovative options vs the traditional single unit meeting. CDC Guidelines as well as all CAP Cadet Protection policies apply.
- **No overnight activities**
- **Masks or face coverings will be worn at all times and by all personnel when indoors**, and outdoors when social distancing is not possible. Face coverings will not display logos, images or messages and should complement the uniform if at all possible.
- Cadets **must** have the NCWG pre-filled CAPF 60-80 and a CAPF 60-81 signed by a parent **QUARTERLY** during Phases 1 and 2 of the remobilization.
- Meeting / activity rosters will be emailed to Lt Col Shelley Gonzales within 24 hours of the meeting. This is to facilitate contact tracing if necessary.





Health and Safety Requirements for Meetings and Activities

- Squadron Commanders will provide CLEAR guidance that members with any respiratory symptoms (sneezing, coughing, congestion) NOT attend the meeting and for members to self-report if they develop symptoms or test positive after attending.
- Squadron HSO's, Commanders or their designated senior member will conduct symptom and temperature checks before entry to the building. Temperature checks may also be conducted before leaving home. CDC defines a fever as greater than 100.4 F
- Verify that hand sanitizer and/or hand washing facilities are available at all times.
- Maintain increased situational awareness of others regarding their social distancing and face coverings.
- Sanitize frequently touched surfaces (door knobs, seats, tables, etc) prior to, during and after the meeting.



Trajectory of COVID-like Syndromic Cases



The percent of visits to the Emergency Department for COVID-like illness is **declining**.





Percent positive for SARS-CoV-2 by date of report among ELR labs



Safer At Home Phase 2.5

Here's what will change:

- **Limits on mass gatherings will increase to 25 people indoors and 50 people outdoors.**
- **Playgrounds will be allowed to open.**

- **Museums and aquariums can open at 50 percent capacity.**
- **Gyms and other indoor exercise facilities can open at 30 percent capacity.**

- **The age requirement for mask wearing will include children down to age 5.**
- **Capacity limits at restaurants and personal care businesses like hair and nail salons will stay the same.**

Some places will remain closed:

- **Bars**
- **Nightclubs**
- **Movie theaters**
- **Indoor entertainment**
- **Amusement parks**

Large venues will still be subject to the mass gathering limits.

We know that big gatherings are among the most dangerous settings for transmission.

The 11 pm curfew on alcohol sales at restaurants has been extended to **October 2.**
