## COVID-19 Remobilization of the Membership Plan - Phase II

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Narrative Summary of Coordination and Events To-Date in North Dakota Wing:

Phone calls and emails conducted for Phase II planning. For phase II, ND Wing has begun planning for three one-day SARX events that have been rescheduled to later dates in anticipation of phase II approval. We are also looking at the feasibility of conducting our ground team academy, SAV and wing conference that were also rescheduled for August/September.

North Dakota remains in the green – low risk level under the states ND Smart Restart Plan enacted 29 May 2020. <a href="https://ndresponse.gov/covid-19-resources/covid-19-business-and-employer-resources/nd-smart-restart/nd-smart-restart-protocols?fbclid=lwAR1X-UpDCd6i2Z6znyvEWclOVNDbCh2SDP9Xe\_y-GtWhd8\_XXUj5f7Q1ycs</a>. Per covidactnow.org website, ND has been at an infection rate of 0.95% trending to .90%, (well below the 1.1 requirement since 22 May), positive test rate of 2.9%, ICU headroom at 6%, and our contact tracing capability has remained at 100% since 27 May. As of 19 June 2020, ND Department of Health data reveals a downward trend with 144,282 tests conducted with 90,654 unique individuals being tested resulting in 87,461 negative tests and 3,193 positive tests. ND currently has a 0.7% daily positivity rate, with 26 currently hospitalized, 208 total hospitalizations, 2,809 total recoveries with 75 deaths.

Once this plan is approved, NDWG CC will work with squadron commanders and activity directors on how to best conduct phase II operations and training. NDWG's remobilization team continues to monitor the process daily and let us know if anything changes. Any changes will be reported, and proper measures put in place. Our proposed phase II transition is 26 June 2020.

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NDWG ABBREVIATED PLAN: Since the number of cases have been decreasing in North Dakota and the lack of any legal restrictions on groups meeting or what individuals can or cannot do, the NDWG proposes allowing CAP activities and units to meet, following the Phase 2 guidelines of no more than 50 people in a room until further notice. If a meeting has more than 50 people, the additional people can participate via online meetings or may be staggered to limit the amount of people meeting to 50 members or less. The same would apply to training activities, aerospace activities, recruiting activities, and most other CAP activities. All members will take their temperature at home or by a no-touch thermometer before entering the meeting place. Wearing of masks and gloves will be optional if social distancing greater than 6 feet separation can be maintained. In all cases, members will practice social distancing. When considering masks in aircraft, we reference the FAA handbook; "... elements or factors affecting individuals are different and profoundly impact decision-making. These are called human factors and can transcend education, experience, health, physiological aspects, etc." Aircrew wear of masks and gloves will be highly encouraged while in the aircraft. Aircrew will have a discussion with each other before entering the aircraft about mask and glove wear and any safety concerns. Personnel in vans will practice social distancing within the vehicle and are highly encouraged to wear masks and, optionally, gloves while in the vehicle. Members will be required to wash their hands or apply hand sanitize at all venues, vehicles, or aircraft. Anyone over the allowed temperature will be sent away. Draft Message to all ND Wing Members (send after approval of Phase II)

NDWG members and staff, great news, we are currently approved to move to Phase II of the COVID-19 Remobilization Plan. Phase II allows for one day events, such as meetings and one day SAREX's. The size of any group is limited to fifty or less. Phase II allows, small-group local crew training, flight evaluations/check rides, crew proficiency, dual instruction, and CAP cadet orientation flights (assuming all members are low-risk and all flights are in low-risk areas). Any SAREX's and other activities will be local or operated as a distributed (Eastern/Western state) SAREX to meet these criteria. In the case of an Eastern/Western area SARX, intermixing of air crew and ground team members between individual squadrons to facilitate training should be held to a minimum. Consideration of each squadron's local area / county COVID-19 conditions must be considered.

Please be sure to re-familiarize yourselves with the information on the links provided. Please note that distancing is still needed. Masks at every activity are highly encouraged and should be worn in most instances when distancing cannot be maintained. Aircrew and vehicle personnel will have a discussion with each other before entering any CAP aircraft or vehicle about mask and glove wear and any safety concerns. A reminder that wearing of masks is for the safety of others, not just ourselves. This matters because about half of those infected will have no symptoms and do not realize that they are potentially risking the life of fellow members. Sanitizing and cleaning of surfaces is required. If masks or cleaning supplies are needed, please look for local supplies. Alcohol bottles and wipes have been purchased by the Wing and placed in every aircraft to use for sanitizing before and after use. Squadrons will need to purchase alcohol and wipes for vehicle sanitizing before and after use. Activity Directors and Squadron Commanders consider screening with no-touch thermometers at events (if such equipment is available and practical) or ask each member to take their temperature before arriving at the event. All personnel shall continue daily temperature checks and monitor for symptoms. If a no-touch thermometer is available, a designated senior member shall be assigned to take temperatures of members prior to entrance to unit events. A temperature of 100.4 or higher shall be considered a fever. Members presenting with fever or other symptoms shall not attend events. Follow all current CAP/CDC guidelines. Activity Directors and Squadron Commanders remind members that identify as High-risk to remain home but participate virtually. Activity Directors and Squadron Commanders shall be aware of high-risk conditions associated with increased mortality in patients with Covid-19.
