COVID-19 Remobilization of the Membership Plan - Phase II

This plan has been developed for Georgia Wing, using the template provided by the Civil Air Patrol National Headquarters to enter Phase II, Resuming One-Day Special Activities.

Additional staffing and resources have been coordinated with SER, to cover gaps in this wing's available resources but none are anticipated.

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Narrative Summary of Coordination and Events To-Date in GA Wing:

Georgia Wing executed mission essential tasks only (as well as approved limited Phase1 flying operations) during Phase 0. Phase 1 Operations began on 3 SEP 2020. The original Phase 1 plan was projected to begin 1 Jul 2020. Due to an increase in COVID 19 in Georgia the implementation of Phase 1 was delayed to 3 Sep 20. We expect to move to Phase 2 operations on 17 September 20 after 14 days of improved or steady COVID 19 metrics. This is based upon data over the past two weeks, even with schools back in session, of metrics holding steady or even declining slightly. We will have two more weeks to watch the data to ensure our decision is supported. For example, utilizing the COVID Act Now site, Daily New Cases has trended down since August 11th from 31.6 to 18.8. The Infection Rate data has trended downward since June 25th from 1.27 to 0.89. The Positive Test Rate has also trended downward since July 23rd from 15.9 to 10.6 (a very slight bump up in the last few days). The critical part of this data is that Georgia schools returned to in class activities two weeks ago and no significant increase in the data has been shown. This means the State of Georgia has measures in place to slow the spread of Covid-19 that, at this time, appear to be working.

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Phase 2 ≤50 Low-Risk Member Meetings

Standard

- Low-risk members may resume unit day-long meetings, activities, and missions as long as ≤50 members, socially distancing, and the activity is one-day in length. All public health protection measures continue.
- Self-identified high-risk Members will continue to utilize video connect to attend meetings and activities.
- Metric to transition to Phase 2 will be at least 14-days of successful Phase 1 metrics, which may take several weeks to months to achieve.
- **Aviation** face coverings and aircraft disinfection between sorties. Includes small-group <u>local</u> crew training, flight evaluations/check rides, crew proficiency, dual instruction and CAP cadet orientation flights (assuming all members are low-risk and all flights are in low-risk areas).

Strategy

- Continue public health protection measures such as: hygiene education, social distancing reminders, temperature checks, face coverings when social distancing is unable to be maintained, and common surface cleaning.
- Place seats 6-feet apart, double arm interval distancing, open air meetings, if possible.
- Food preparation should be done individually no family style or buffet meals, due to the possibility of utensil cross-contamination.

SUBJECT: Phase II Post COVID-19 Remobilization

- 1. Georgia Wing is preparing to move into Phase II of CAP's post-COVID19 remobilization. We anticipate that NHQ will approve us to move to CAP's Phase II effective 17 September 20.
- 2. Training and one-day activities may be conducted as outlined for Phase II in the GAWG PLAN. Maximum group size is now limited to 50 persons. These members will be screened to make sure they are low risk with no symptoms of COVID 19 or fever. In person events should be planned, organized, and conducted with the concept of social distancing in mind (6 feet minimum). Indoor formations are strongly discouraged. Outdoor formations may be conducted as long as all personnel are at least 6 or more feet apart. Cleaning and sanitization activities must be maintained.
- 3. Cadet Activities: Planning should begin to establish training and activities appropriate to Phase 2.
- 4. Emergency Services: Planning should begin to conduct training exercises this Fall to reinforce skills and upgrade members in needed ES tasks.

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5. Flight operations:

- Flight Evaluations/check rides
- Local crew training Crew Proficiency
- Dual Instruction (including cadet flight instruction) and Cadet Orientation flights
- Small Group Crew Training (units or groups of locally conducted training for members to earn crew qualifications, no large classes (over 50 people) and avoid any potential for overnight activities.
- Carefully pre-scheduled local CAP Orientation Flights. Commanders will execute concurrent training before, during and after the orientation flights to keep Cadets from congregating. Cadets will show up at the appointed time and place and training will be conducted on a variety of assigned topics. Cadets can move from the classroom to the preflight briefing and to their assigned aircraft. After the post flight briefing the Cadets can return to an assigned class/activity. Everyone will wear a mask and execute social distancing requirements. Squadron Commanders and the O Flight coordinator are responsible to review the Cadet records to make sure that they are assigned the correct module for powered syllabus flight (or Glider Flights) IAW CAPP 60-40. Additionally, Commanders will confirm all Cadets have a CAP ID are current members and are in the proper uniform for flight.

6. Training priorities:

- a. Cadet Activities: CAP cadet orientation rides will resume immediately and planning for this is already underway. To ensure the availability of FY 20 funds, O Flight weekends are being planned and coordinated at several locations in the State for the final two weekends in September. These Cadet O Flights serve two critical purposes to our mission; Cadet retention and motivation as well as Pilot proficiency and motivation. These will resume while using all safety control measures. Squadron Commanders and/or local O Flight Coordinators will insure that safe and effective meeting places are available for all activities. The WG Director of Cadet Programs will suggest Cadets activities that will enhance our Cadet Program once we transition to Phase 2 and later activities.
- b. Flight Operations: The WG/DO will continue to monitor and staff the onboarding and training of all aircrew. Additional priority is to support the CAP Cadet orientation flights throughout the Wing. Collective training is authorized with the use of virtual or onsite IC to capitalize on lessons learned from recent activities. WG/DO will host a stan/eval meeting with the express purpose of identifying aircrew skills that have atrophied during the COVID 19 reduced OPTEMPO. The results of this meeting will be a suggested training plan to correct training deficiencies for all aircrew.

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- c. Emergency Services: The planning for ES activities will begin in earnest with events scheduled by the end of the calendar year. The priority is to do a "table top" staff exercise this year using the leadership that will plan and conduct ES training events in the first quarter of CY 2021.
 - d. Aerospace Education: One day events may be planned and executed after approval by the chain of command.
- e. SAREX may be planned and executed. Continue to capitalize on lessons learned from using a virtual IC concept developed during Phase 0 operations.
- 7. Safety and hygiene practices as outline in the GAWG Remobilization Phase 1 plan remain in effect and will continue to be followed.

Those self-identified as low risk category may return to meetings as long as groups are <10 and socially distancing and wearing face

- Member that are sick must stay home
- Close common areas or enforce strict social distancing protocols.
- Minimize non-essential travel and adhere to CDC guidelines regarding isolation following travel

Phase 1

Trigger: Earliest Dates Map or State Order (whichever is later)

Selected CAP Low-Risk Staff with meetings <10, in preparation of full activities Those self-identified as low-risk IAW CDC guidance may resume unit meetings, activities, and missions as long as <50 members and socially distancing.

- Non-essential travel may resume with consideration for varying risk level
- Continue public health protection measures such as: hygiene education, social distancing, hand washing breaks, asking members if they feel well before meetings/missions, temperature checks. face coverings when unable to maintain 6-foot distance, and common surface cleaning.
- Self Identified high-risk Members continue to telework and those who are sick should stay home

Increasing community presence of COVID-19 Reducing community Presence of COVID-19

- One-Day activities only for ≤50 members.
- Continue to encourage telework and the use of alternating schedules to reduce workforce density.
- Close common areas where personnel are likely to congregate and interact, or enforce moderate social distancing protocols.

Phase 2

Trigger for Phase 2: Schools Reopening Order or State notification of Phase 2

All CAP Low-Risk Staff with full activities

- Those self-identified as high-risk IAW CDC auidance may aradually return to intermittent unit, activity, and mission duties, however, should continue social distancing.
- Those with external factors, such as childcare availability or those without low-risk commuting options will gradually return.
- Refrain from crowds

Highest Membership Density

- Overnight activities start 6-feet between bed
- Commanders, Activity Directors, and Incident Commanders should personally greet returning
- · Consider hand washing / sanitizing at beginning and end of meetings.
- · Voluntary temperature checks may be used to allow entry into activities.
- · Public Health Protection Measures may consist of common surface cleaning, social distancing for high risk categories, crowd reminders, and logistically preparing for any further COVID

Phase 3

Trigger for Phase 3: State or Local Government notification of Phase 3

Full CAP activities are cautiously re-opened



- Members Self Identify risk to themselves and family member IAW CDC guidance and notify their supervisor.
- This scale is bidirectional the dynamic nature of the COVID-19 status will require continued re-evaluation
- Phase of operation will be identified by the State or City Government in which the Unit or Activity is operated
