

PUERTO RICO WING Overcoming Challenges: A Journey to Success

The Puerto Rico Wing responded to new challenges in 2020 while providing a professional, safe and effective way to serve the commonwealth and its communities. Early in the year, members of the wing conducted damage assessment and worked with personnel from various agencies in responding to a series of earthquakes off the southern coast.

Wing ground teams provided photographs of damaged structures and facilities in the municipalities of Peñuelas, Yauco, Guanica and Guayanilla. The images helped officials shape rescue and recovery efforts. For the first time in Puerto Rico, trained wing crews used small Unmanned Aerial Systems to take photos and video and coordinated with search and rescue managers to provide overhead support for ground operations.

Members also provided post-quake community support by assisting local agencies in refugee shelters and supplying points of distribution.

During Puerto Rico's response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the wing's primary role was transporting contact tracing teams, test kits and personal protective equipment (PPE) to remote locations. Members combined for more than 2,000 volunteer hours in delivering 624,174 masks, 13,600 face shields, 450,300 gloves, 37,125 hand sanitizer bottles, 33,950 antibacterial gel bottles, 9,700 disinfectant wipes, 386 1-gallon bottles of liquid sanitizer, 145 test samples and 12,096 bottles of water.

Wing members also helped distribute 3,000 meal boxes in support of community organizations, assisting with food delivery to some communities after identifying bedridden and disabled people without transportation.
