Aircraft Maintenance

CIVIL AIR PATROL AIRCRAFT MAINTENANCE MANAGEMENT

CAP Regulation 130-2, dated 4 October 2021, is supplemented as follows:

2.2.1 Added. Squadrons. When a squadron has been assigned custody of a CAP aircraft, the Squadron Commander will assign a Unit Maintenance Officer (MO) in eServices.

2.2.2 Added. Maintenance Officer Training requirement applies to Assistant AMO(s) and Unit MOs.

2.3.1 Added. Squadron Unit Maintenance Officer (MO) Responsibilities.

2.3.1.1 Added. Monitor aircraft maintenance requirements in AMRAD and coordinate any scheduled or unscheduled maintenance actions with the Wing AMO on the aircraft assigned to the unit.

2.3.1.2 Added. Monitor AMRAD aircraft discrepancy files. Look for opportunities to correct deferred discrepancies when aircraft is scheduled to have other maintenance performed. If parts are needed for a deferred discrepancy, coordinate with WG AMO.

5.9.1 Added. When transferring an aircraft to and/or from another Wing, MO will forward a copy of the completed Form 71/71G to Wing AMO within 30 days of the transfer.

11.3.1 Added. When possible, pilots and aircrew should ensure the windscreen, leading edges and interior are cleaned after flight. Involve other aircrew members when available.

14.5.1 Added. Squadrons will inventory and inspect survival kits at least annually. Expired items will be replaced or removed. See Attachment 2 for minimum survival kit inventory.

ATTACHMENT 2**SURVIVAL KIT INVENTORY CHECKLIST**

Current copy shall be retained in the survival kit and AIF TAB 7 for reference

Recommended max weight – 30 lbs.

Containment bag large enough for all items listed below

Aluminum foil - 11'

Emergency blanket, thermal type or wool – 4ea

First aid kit, small – 1ea

Bandages - 4

Candle, medium – 4ea

Compass, lensatic -1ea

Compress pads – 10ea

Duct tape – 1 roll

Fire starter, flint, or magnesium type – 1ea

Emergency ponchos – 4ea

Finger saw – 1ea

Gloves, insulated – 4ea

Knife, multi tool – 1ea

Chem light stick – 4ea

Cotton balls - 1gal bag – may be used for fire starters, first aid

Plastic trash bag, 30 gal – 4ea

Survival mirror – 1ea

Parachute, 550, cord – 50'

Wet wipes / baby wipes – 1 small package

Watch cap, wool – 4ea

Waterproof matches, in waterproof container – 1ea

Whistle – 1ea

Zip-lock bags, 1 gal – 10ea

Items which may have expiration dates; replace or remove.

Antibiotic jelly – 1 tube

Food bars – 8ea

Water purification tablets – 1 bottle
