CIVIL AIR PATROL AIRCRAFT MAINTENANCE MANAGEMENT

CAP Regulation 66-1, dated 14 September 2015 which includes ICL 17-06 dated 28 JULY 2017 and ICL 18-04 dated 14 JUNE 2018, is supplemented as follows:

4.1. Added. Each Idaho Wing Unit, that is assigned a CAP Corporate Aircraft, will have a Unit Maintenance Officer assigned in eServices. This Unit Maintenance Officer will coordinate any maintenance requirements and actions on the aircraft assigned to their unit with the Idaho Wing Maintenance Officer (IDWG/DOM) or assistant(s).

4.2. Added. Consolidated Maintenance Management Program (CMMP). The Unit Maintenance Officer will coordinate discrepancy repairs with IDWG/DOM.

4.3. Added. Unit Maintenance Officer is responsible for aircraft upkeep, serviceability, and cleanliness.

4.3.1 Added. Unit Maintenance Officer is responsible for Aircraft Information Folder (AIF) for aircraft assigned to their unit.

8.4.1. Added. PIC's shall review the Discrepancy Log in AMRAD prior to each flight. The PIC, at the conclusion of a flight, in a CAP aircraft, shall immediately enter any discrepancy issues, for the flight just flown, into AMRAD. The PIC shall then notify the Unit Maintenance Officer or Incident Commander of such discrepancies for that aircraft, so the appropriate corrective action can be initiated by the Unit Maintenance Officer through the IDWG/DOM.

10.5.1. Added. The Contents of each aircraft survival kit shall be in accordance with ATTACHMENT 1. Units may supplement the survival kit contents to support local environmental requirements. Survival Kits will be inspected annually to insure contents remain in accordance with ATTACHMENT 1.

**ATTACHMENT 1  
SURVIVAL KIT CHECKLIST**

Current copy shall be retained in the survival kit and AIF TAB #2 for reference

Recommended max weight – 30 lbs

- Containment bag large enough for all items listed below
- Aluminum foil - 11'
- Emergency blanket, thermal type or wool – 4ea
- First aid kit, small – 1ea
- Bandages - 4
- Candle, medium – 4ea
- Compass, lensatic -1ea
- Compress pads – 10ea
- Duct tape – 1 roll
- Fire starter, flint or magnesium type – 1ea
- Emergency ponchos – 4ea
- Finger saw – 1ea
- Gloves, insulated – 4ea
- Knife, multi tool – 1ea
- Chem light stick – 4ea
- Cotton balls - 1gal bag – may be used for fire starters, first aid
- Plastic trash bag, 30 gal – 4ea
- Survival mirror – 1ea
- Parachute, 550, cord – 50'
- Wet wipes / baby wipes – 1 small package
- Watch cap, wool – 4ea
- Waterproof matches, in waterproof container – 1ea
- Whistle – 1ea
- Zip-lock bags, 1 gal – 10ea

Items which may have expiration dates, replace as required

- Antibiotic jelly – 1 tube
- Emergency drinking water, 4oz – 8ea OR 4 bottles of water
- Food bars – 8ea
- Water purification tablets – 1 bottle
