## Stacy Jackson

Stacy Jackson is Civil Air Patrol's chief financial officer. In her role as CAP's CFO, she oversees all financial aspects of the organization, including, but not limited to, managing over \$75 million in federal grant funds, over \$10 million in state grant funds, approximately \$15 million in accounts payable, approximately \$20 million in accounts receivable, and multiple budgets. In addition to managing these resources, she provides strategic financial leadership to support CAP's national programs, mission readiness, and long-term organizational stability.

She also serves as the treasurer for the Civil Air Patrol Foundation, which includes assets of over \$6 million.

Jackson began her accounting career as a financial analyst for Standard Systems Group at Maxwell Air Force Base-Gunter Annex while still in college. Over the past 25-plus years, she has gained extensive experience in government, not-for-profit, and private organizations of various sizes.

She previously worked at CAP for 9½ years, holding several roles including wing financial analyst, budget analyst, and accounting manager. She returned to CAP as the CFO in 2017, bringing her wealth of experience and dedication to the organization.

Before returning to CAP, Jackson was the accounting supervisor at Raycom Media, a national media company based in Montgomery, Alabama. There, she managed a team of staff accountants, ensured timely and accurate financial reporting in compliance with accounting standards, and oversaw the budgeting process.

Jackson earned her bachelor's degree in accounting from Huntingdon College and her master's degree in business administration from Auburn University of Montgomery. She is a Certified Public Accountant (CPA) in Alabama and holds a Certified Fraud Examiner (CFE) certification.

Originally from Prattville, Alabama, Jackson has spent most of her life in the Montgomery and Prattville area. She moved to Foley, Alabama, in 2021 and still resides there with her husband, son, and two dogs.
