CIVIL AIR PATROL UNIFORM MANUAL

CAP Manual 39-1, dated 26 June 2014, is supplemented as follows:

4.2.5.8. The Texas Wing ES Baseball Cap is authorized for wear with the Male Aviator Shirt Uniform. This headgear is only authorized for wear within Texas Wing.

4.2.6.8. The Texas Wing ES Baseball Cap is authorized for wear with the Female Aviator Shirt Uniform. This headgear is only authorized for wear within Texas Wing.

5.2.1.8. The Texas Wing ES Baseball Cap is authorized for wear with the Corporate Field Uniform (dark blue, BDU style). This headgear is only authorized for wear within Texas Wing.

5.2.2.7. The Texas Wing ES Baseball Cap is authorized for wear with the CAP Corporate Working Uniform (blue polo combination). This headgear is only authorized for wear within Texas Wing.

6.2.1. Men's Service Cap (Wheel Cap). Cadet Officers are authorized to wear the men's service cap only with the Service Dress Uniform and not with the Service Uniform. This supplement was suggested by the Texas Wing CAC, 2000-2001.

6.2.2. Women's Service Cap (Bucket Cap). Female Cadet Officers are authorized to wear the women's service cap only with the Service Dress Uniform and not with the Service Uniform. This supplement was suggested by the Texas Wing CAC, 2000-2001.

6.2.9. CAP Baseball Cap. The Texas Wing ES Baseball Cap is authorized only for wear with the Aviator Shirt Uniform, Corporate Field Uniform (dark blue, BDU style), CAP Corporate Working Uniform (blue polo combination), USAF-style Flight Duty Uniform (green flight suit), and the Corporate-style Flight Duty Uniform (blue flight suit). This headgear is only authorized for wear within Texas Wing. This headwear is not authorized for wear with woodland camouflage Battle Dress Uniform (BDU), Airman Battle Uniform (ABU), or the Blue Service Uniform (USAF blue shirt).

8.2.7.3. The Texas Wing ES Baseball Cap is authorized for wear with the USAF-style Flight Duty Uniform (green flight suit). This headgear is only authorized for wear within Texas Wing.

8.3.8. The Texas Wing ES Baseball Cap is authorized for wear with the Corporate-style Flight Duty Uniform (blue flight suit). This headgear is only authorized for wear within Texas Wing.

9.4.1. Shoulder Cords. The cadet has the option of the cord they wish to wear except as noted below. Shoulder cords authorized for wear by this supplement are not authorized for wear outside Texas Wing. Senior members are not authorized to wear shoulder cords.

9.4.1.1. Added. Cadet Training and Education Program (CTEP). Cadet graduates of the Texas Wing Cadet Training and Education Program (CTEP) are authorized to wear distinctive shoulder cords authorized in accordance with that activity's procedures. CTEP shoulder cords are not authorized for wear outside Texas Wing. Cadet graduates of CTEP will wear the cord of the highest school completed or another authorized cord of the cadet's choice. CTEP shoulder cords are authorized at all Texas Wing activities except Wing Encampment. Wear of CTEP shoulder cords at Wing Encampment is at the discretion of the Encampment Commander. Cadet graduates of each CTEP school may wear shoulder cords in the respective colors listed below. Cadet graduates of each CTEP school may only wear the cord of that school up to and including the cadet grade listed below.

9.4.1.1.1. Added. Royal Blue and Jay Blue – Airman Leadership School (ALS). Cadet graduates of ALS are authorized to wear this shoulder cord up to and including the grade of Cadet/ Staff Sergeant.

9.4.1.1.2. Added. Royal Blue and Red – Non-Commissioned Officer Academy (NCOA). Cadet graduates of NCOA are authorized to wear this shoulder cord up to and including the grade of Cadet/ Chief Master Sergeant.

9.4.1.1.3. Added. Royal Blue and Yellow – Senior Non-Commissioned Officer Academy (SNCOA). Cadet graduates of SNCOA are authorized to wear this shoulder cord up to and including the grade of Cadet/ Second Lieutenant.

9.4.1.1.4. Added. Royal Blue and White – Officer Training School (OTS). Cadet graduates of OTS are authorized to wear this shoulder cord up to and including the grade of Cadet/ Major.

9.4.1.1.5. Added. Royal Blue and Metallic Silver – Cadet Command and Staff College (CCSC). Cadet graduates of CCSC are authorized to wear this shoulder cord through the remainder of the cadet program.

9.4.1.1.6. Added. Instructors. Cadet instructors of the various CTEP schools are authorized to wear the shoulder cord of their respective school with silver ferrule. Cadets who have successfully served as an instructor of a CTEP school are authorized to wear the respective instructor shoulder cord through the remainder of the cadet program.

9.4.1.2. Added. Squadron Cadet Commander. Current Cadet Commanders of a Texas Wing squadron may wear a forest green shoulder cord at any activity of the cadet's squadron and Texas Wing Conference. The cord will not be worn at Wing Encampment or any activity not hosted by the cadet's squadron. The cord is not authorized for wear after completion of the cadet's term as Cadet Commander. The cord is worn at the discretion of the cadet's Squadron Commander.

9.4.1.3. Added. Encampment Cadet Commander. The Cadet Commander of a Texas Wing Encampment is authorized to wear a forest green and white shoulder cord during the encampment. Cadets who have successfully served as a Cadet Commander of a Texas Wing Encampment are authorized to wear the forest green and white shoulder cord through the remainder of the cadet program.

9.4.1.4. Added. Ground Search and Rescue Specialty School (GSARSS) and Lone Star Emergency Services Academy (LESA). Cadet graduates of the Texas Wing Ground Search and Rescue Specialty School (GSARSS) and Lone Star Emergency Services Academy (LESA, LESA South) are authorized to wear distinctive shoulder cords authorized in accordance with that activity's procedures. GSARSS/LESA shoulder cords are not authorized for wear outside Texas Wing. Cadet graduates of GSARSS/LESA will wear the cord of the highest school completed or another authorized cord of the cadet's choice. GSARSS/LESA shoulder cords are authorized at all Texas Wing activities except Wing Encampment. Cadet graduates of each GSARSS/LESA school may wear shoulder cords in the respective colors listed below through the remainder of the cadet program.

9.4.1.4.1. Added. Black – Basic Ground Search and Rescue Specialty School.

9.4.1.4.2. Added. Black and Gold – Advanced Ground Search and Rescue Specialty School.

9.4.1.5. Added. Encampment Advanced Training Squadron (ATS). Cadet graduates of the Texas Wing Encampment Advanced Training Squadron (ATS) are authorized to wear royal blue and forest green shoulder cords authorized in accordance with that activity's procedures. ATS shoulder cords are not authorized for wear outside Texas Wing. ATS shoulder cords are authorized at all Texas Wing activities through the remainder of the cadet program.
