Information for Teachers Who Desire to be Adopted:

1. INTRODUCTION OF THE ADOPT PROGRAM:

- a. Review the Adopt info flier.
- b. Review the <u>K-6th grade Aerospace Connections in Education (ACE) program</u>, as this is the foundational curriculum for the "Adopt" program and the teacher will need to register for the ACE program.
- c. As security checks for visitors entering schools is important, each adult CAP member has passed a complete FBI background check.
- **2. JOIN:** Teachers have to be CAP members to participate. If not already a CAP member, the teacher should join as an Aerospace Education Member (AEM).
 - a. The free benefits that come with a CAP AE membership are found on the Educators Page.
 - b. CAP will waive the one-time \$35 membership fee for any <u>new AEM</u> who will be participating in this program. (Contact <u>adopt@capnhq.gov</u> for free Coupon Code for program.)
- **3. REGISTER:** Once the teacher is a member, the teacher should register for the ACE program. (ACE registration directions are found at the top of the <u>ACE webpage</u>.)
 - a. 5th grade teachers register their students for the 5th grade curriculum.
 - b. 6^{th} , 7^{th} , or 8^{th} grade teachers register their 6^{th} , 7^{th} and 8^{th} students for the 6^{th} grade curriculum.
 - c. Your grade level ACE class sets of manipulative items will be sent to you (as will ACE certificates for end-of-program certificate presentations). Please do not use the class set of student manipulatives until the squadron can come and conduct one or more aligned lessons using these items. All other Adopt materials will be sent to the squadron to bring when they do the other lessons with your class.
- **4. REQUEST:** If a teacher desires to be adopted, he/she should:
 - a. complete the teacher section of the Request to Collaborate form; and,
 - b. submit to their state's Director of AE (DAE). (See the listing for each state DAE HERE.)
- **5. CONNECT:** The DAE will then locate the closest CAP squadron to the teacher's ZIP code and request support for the teacher. Once a squadron has agreed to collaborate with the teacher, the squadron PoC will complete the <u>squadron section</u> of the *Request* form.
- **6. PREPARE for PROGRAM:** The DAE will send the *Request* form to CAP's National HQ.
 - CAP National HQ will then ship all <u>ADOPT MATERIALS</u> to the squadron that will adopt the teacher. (It should take NHQ 2 weeks to get the materials shipped to the squadron PoC.)
- 7. IMPLEMENT: The teacher may want to review the <u>LESSON OPTIONS</u>.
 - a. The squadron PoC should work with the teacher to schedule instructional dates/times.

- b. The teacher can share which three lessons he/she would prefer.
- c. The squadron will also need to plan a date/time for the cadets to share information about the Cadet Program with the students.
- d. The teacher and squadron will want to take photographs and videos.
 - ***Ensure students have media permission to have photos taken and used by CAP.
- e. After the minimum of 3 lessons are completed, if additional activities are desired by the squadron and the teachers, those can be planned. (See <u>ADDITIONAL ACTIVITY IDEAS</u>, which include program "lift-off ideas," information about purchasing <u>ACE shirts</u>, and other ideas the squadron POC may like to try with the students.)
- **8. PROGRAM COMPLETION:** The squadron and teacher have the entire school year to complete the program. Once all activities have been completed, the following needs to be done:
 - a. Plan a date for the squadron participants to make end-of-program ACE certificate presentations to the students.
 - c. Teacher and squadron PoC should both complete and submit their end-of-program <u>evaluation</u> form to <u>adopt@capnhq.gov</u> not later than 1 June.
