## Wing Provides State Support During Pandemic

2020 marked a new level of service and commitment for the Wisconsin Wing. Though COVID-19 restrictions curtailed most of the wing's routine operations and likewise led to the cancellation of major events like the annual EAA AirVenture in Oshkosh, members nonetheless stepped up to provide unparalleled support to the Badger State as it battled the pandemic.

Early on, the wing filled a critical transportation shortfall within the state by delivering needed COVID-19 test kits to some of Wisconsin's most remote counties. The wing's members then moved on to provide direct support to the Wisconsin Elections Commission. Working hand-in-hand with the state National Guard, which coordinated logistical and manpower support, the wing delivered all the cleaning, sanitation, personal protective equipment and office supplies needed to safely manage all 2,661 polling locations.


Starting with delivery of critical supplies to 22 northern counties before the 7th Congressional District's special election in May, the wing continued deliveries

for both the August primary election as well as the November general election, moving supplies from Madison to all 72 county clerks, often making multiple trips per county for each election as the needed supplies arrived on irregular schedules.

Wing members made 240 individual deliveries totaling 6,252 cases of supplies, driving more than 68,000 miles and flying some 42 hours to complete deliveries to the most remote counties. In all, they devoted almost

6,400 hours to the effort — saving the state over a quarter of a million dollars in combined delivery costs and volunteer effort.

Meanwhile, members continued to materially support the safety and security of the state and nation, carrying out 12 search and rescue missions, two Lake Michigan shoreline erosion survey missions, a military training route survey and 18 air defense training missions.
